### 7:30 am – 8:30 am Delegate's and Companion's Breakfast with Jason Brolund Topic: The Future in Unity: 100 Years of Firefighting... in 36 hours

Full buffet breakfast followed by West Kelowna Fire Rescue Fire Chief Jason Brolund for a behindthe-scenes glimpse of the 2023 McDougall Creek Wildfire. In August of 2023, West Kelowna and Westbank First Nation was devastated by a fast-moving wildfire, fueled by high winds and extreme drought conditions. At the height of the fire over 35,000 were evacuated and 30,000 on evacuation alert across the region. Sadly, 190 homes were lost however there was no loss of life. Emergency responders came from around the province and across the globe to help. The event attracted international media attention. Chief Brolund will share the story of the massive emergency response, the communities' resilience and what to expect after a major emergency incident turns the world around you upside down.
